## Morehead-Rowan County Airport Board Meeting Meeting Minutes July 27, 2023

Chairman Bruce Mattingly called the meeting to order at 6:00 pm in the Airport Conference Room with board members David Perkins, Tim James, Charles Derrickson, Tom Fossett, Bob Helton, and Porter Dailey. Members absent were Ron Oliver, Shannon Murphy, and Wes Holland. Guests present via Zoom were Jack Holley, Jr. – FBO, Holley Aviation LLC and Will Adams – PE, Garver. The guests present were Earl Rogers III – Attorney, Campbell Rogers & Stacy PLLC, and Barbara Marsh – Assistant Secretary/Treasurer.

Dr. Mattingly presented the Minutes of the June 2023 meeting. The motion to approve the June 29, 2023, Meeting Minutes was made by Mr. James, seconded by Dr. Derrickson, and approved unanimously.

Dr. Mattingly presented the June 2023 financial reports consisting of Statements of Activity and Financial Position. The motion to approve the June 2023 financial reports was made by Mr. Helton, seconded by Mr. James, and approved unanimously.

## **Reports**

- a. **FBO Report.** Mr. Holley reported on airport activities, maintenance, and fuel.
- 1. Fuel Report June. 634 gallons AvGas100LL; 1613 gallons JETA.
- 2. <u>Community Hangar/Tie Downs</u>. Matt Oldham-Eagle Upholstery; Zane McGlade; Brandon Hamilton. Tie Downs: Charlie Hamilton and Johnnie Broughton.
- 3. <u>Hangars</u>. Mr. Beller is still looking for a plane and Mr. Reinhart is occupying B7.
- 4. <u>REIL Lights</u>. The northeast REIL lights have been acting up and need to be checked out for faintly strobing, and not acting predictably, which could be a hazard for night activity. Brewer Electric will be contacted to review the issue.
- 5. <u>Old Plow Truck.</u> The 1993 International plow truck was sold for \$3,000. The old fuel truck is next in line to be sold via appropriate means.

#### b. Garver Report. Mr. Adams

1. <u>Airfield Electrical – Radio Interference</u>. We have been back and forth with the equipment manufacturer, ADB. ADB's technician, who was most knowledgeable with our interference issues, is no longer with the company. There was a discussion about the next steps that the airport needs to take.

#### 2. Apron Expansion Project.

- An FAA grant amendment document will circulate through sponsors, the airport board and attorneys for original signatures and forwarded to the FAA.
- Mr. Adams answered a question about concrete and the estimated number of cubic yards of earthwork in the project. The concrete thickness and base material should support a parked aircraft weighing up to 100,000 lbs.
- Due to delays with grant documents a motion to allow the chairman to sign a Notice to Proceed on behalf of the Board, not to exceed current FAA grant authorizations, was made by Mr. Dailey, seconded by Mr. Perkins, and approved unanimously.
- Shamrock, the contractor, said they would be willing to start ASAP and attend a preconstruction meeting as early as next week. At least one airport person is requested to attend the meeting. Will advise meeting date after speaking with the contractor.
- Many submittals have already been received.
- Early work will include erosion control and fencing.
- Mr. Adams has arranged for an observer.
- All details will be in the bid document including questions asked about crushed stone base and electrical. We will receive 2 copies of the plans.

## c. Buildings & Grounds Report. Mr. Oliver, Dr. Derrickson

<u>Hay & Gravel Road.</u> Dr. Derrickson reported that the county road crew realized after the fact they had graded/graveled the wrong service road. MSU farm made the first cut of hay for the year and Mike Dement, MSU's farm manager, reported an improvement in the quality of the hay due to our application of fertilizer.

#### e. **Chair Report**. Dr. Mattingly, Chair

<u>Hangar Land Lease & Building Specs</u>. In moving forward with the Apron Expansion Project, we need to create construction and related specifications for prospective tenants. Mr. Ryan Sisemore, Garver Vice President, will be contacted for a quote on a standard set of specs consistent with FAA regs and our needs. Mr. Helton asked if we are assuming the tenant will build and that we own the land as a lease, that notion was affirmed. Land lease documents from other airports are to be reviewed as guidance in forming our agreements. It should be noted that, if funds were available in the future the board could consider constructing an airport owned hangar for lease.

#### **I. New Business**

a. <u>Approval of 2022-23 Final (actual) Budget.</u> Dr. Mattingly reported we had \$2300 less in expenditures which lowered the amount needed to transfer from facilities reserve fund for the purchase of the two new vehicles from \$72,997 to \$70,658. The motion to approve the final budget FY23 was made by Mr. Dailey, seconded by Dr. Derrickson, and approved unanimously.
